Mental Health and Suicide Prevention

More than Sad: Educators

Teachers and other school personnel can learn how to recognize the signs of mental health distress in students, the warning signs of suicide, and steps that you can take to get help for at risk students.

More than Sad: Parents

Parents and guardians of teen youth can learn how to recognize signs of depression and other mental health problems, initiate a conversation about mental health, and how to get help.

Mental Health and Suicide Prevention

Mental Health First Aid

Learn the risk factors and warning signs of various mental health conditions and how to support an individual in these situations with a 5-step plan. This training does not teach you to diagnose, treat, or counsel individuals.

It's Real: Teens and Mental Health for Middle School Students

This training provides young people ages 11-14 with mental health education and resources.

Course Hours - 1

It's Real: Teens and Mental Health for High School Students

This training provides young people ages 14-18 with mental health education and resources.

It's Real: College Students and Mental Health

This training features real stories and experiences of those with depression and other mental health conditions, and it encourages students to be mindful of their mental health, and the steps they can take to get help.

Mental Health and Suicide Prevention

Talk Saves Lives: Standard

An American Foundation of Suicide Prevention standardized program that provides participants with an understanding of suicide, up to date research on suicide prevention, and what they can do to save lives.

All Course Hours - 1

Talk Saves Lives: Workplace Setting

This training can be delivered to organizational leadership, managers, or employees, and it provides education about suicide warning signs, risk factors, and the role we all play in suicide prevention.

Talk Saves Lives: Firearms and Suicide

Developed for the firearms community, this training can be presented at a firearms club, a retailer, or to firearms safety course instructors.

Talk Saves Lives: Correctional Environment

Incarcerated individuals and corrections staff are particularly vulnerable to suicide, for a variety of complex reasons.

Talk Saves Lives: Seniors

Learn the warning signs and risk factors in elderly populations and what their loved ones can do to connect them to help.

Talk Saves Lives: LGBTQ

Those in the LGBTQ community face additional challenges and barriers to accessing help due to discrimination, this training informs participants of the best ways to provide care and support to those who need it.

Generational Impact of Substance Misuse: Strategies for Prevention and Intervention

This training equips participants with knowledge, skills, and practical strategies to address and mitigate the generational impact of substance misuse.

Substance Misuse & Gambling Prevention

Teen Intervene

Learn how to implement this evidence based program for teenagers (12-19) experiencing mild to moderate problems associated with alcohol or other drug use.

Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

Develop the knowledge, skills, and abilities to facilitate SBIRT utilizing assessment tools and motivational interviewing techniques.

Signs and Symptoms of Substance Abuse

Learn to recognize drug misuse and paraphernalia that could indicate substance use, and where to get help. Course Hours - 1

Participants learn what to look for, when to speak up, an overview of risk factors, and threats that could be a red flag for destructive behavior.

Substance Misuse **Education**

TIPs

This course provides the legal responsibilities for selling and serving alcohol, explains illegal sales, and provides extensive information about checking IDs and documenting incidents. It also describes signs of intoxication to look out for and other relevant information about alcohol to help servers serve more responsibly. Versions offered are onpremises, off-premises, and University.

Learn to identify signs and symptoms of withdrawal and prevention techniques for marijuana use for those who work with, or family of, college age students and teens.

CCAR Recovery Basics

This course explores how to support and advocate for recovery, and provides a brief overview of the Recovery Coach Academy material.

CCAR Recovery Coaching in the ER

I am Little Red (Erin's Law Approved Curriculum)

This presentation for grades 7 & 8 starts with a 10 minute animated movie, followed by a discussion about different tactics traffickers use, and how to use internet safely.

How Human Trafficking Affects the LGBTQIA+ Community (Grades 9-12)

This presentation includes information on human trafficking such as tactics traffickers use, red flags, statistics, with a focus on the LGBTQIA+ population.

Participants will be able to understand what sextortion is, identify red flags, and learn how sextortion can relate to suicide and mental health challenges.

Internet Safety and Trafficking

Identifying Commercialized Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) Parts 1 & 2 (Administration or Adults)

This training includes identifying red flags, learning trauma informed principles for responding to youth, and how to support trafficked youth.

Safety Planning Around Social Media (Administration or Adults)

This training includes information on various apps, human trafficking, and how to safely use social media/the internet to create a Safety Plan.

How Social Media Affects Child Exploitation (Administration or Adults)

This training includes information on various apps, how the apps are being used in Human Trafficking, and how to use these apps to protect private information.

Sextortion & Suicide (Administration or Adults)

Participants will be able to understand what sextortion is, identify red flags, and learn how sextortion can relate to suicide or mental health challenges.

Labor Trafficking: Lessons Learned & Survivor Diary (Adults)

This presentation provides information on labor trafficking, what it looks like in a rural vs. urban area, and a survivor story from a client Herkimer County has worked with.
